Professor Vaughn Walton Named Highly Cited Researcher



[Vaughn Walton](#) (Dept. of Horticulture) is one of three academics from the College of Agricultural Sciences that has been named Highly Cited Researchers, according to the Web of Science Group. The group identifies scientists who produced multiple papers ranking in the top 1% by citations in the world for their field and year of publication, demonstrating significant research influence among peers. It also bears noting that of the 10 researchers in the state recognized for this honor this year, seven are with OSU and three of those seven are in the College of Agricultural Sciences. Did you know that the majority of the [American Society for Enology and Viticulture \(ASEV\)](#) members (67%) are industry professionals just like you? Only 30% of the society is comprised of academics and students, yet the national conference attendance has been mostly academics. The national conference is held annually, rotating between west coast wine regions. The [71st ASEV National Conference](#) will be held in downtown Portland in June 2020. Researchers from across the nation and world will present the latest research advances in viticulture and enology. The event is designed for industry professionals to learn about research to improve grape and wine production. The Society is encouraging industry participation, and we hope that you and fellow Oregon wine industry members will attend. This is such a great opportunity that the Oregon Wine Research Institute will forgo its annual research event (OWRI Grape Day) in lieu of the ASEV National Conference being in state. Much of the research that the OWRI team would present at our local event will be represented at the ASEV National Conference in presentations and/or posters. We know that time and resources are limited to attend educational events, but this event is well worth the investment. We have no doubt that you and/or members of your production team will leave the meeting with a broader scope of science-based information to improve your vineyard or winery production. The national conference is also a great place to interact with experts, obtain professional development, and network with others from within and outside your production region.
