Extension Vineyard Mechanization Workshop Series

Winter vineyard mechanization workshop in the Umpqua Valley

The first vineyard mechanization workshop in the 2019 OWRI/OSU series will be held at two locations in the Umpqua Valley. This event will provide information about pruning and trunk disease and will demonstrate mechanical pruning methods.

Teal Stone, Blue Heron Vineyard manager, and Klima representative, will demonstrate the use of the Klima mechanical cane pruning machine on Scott Henry trained vines. Dr. Patty Skinkis, OSU Viticulture Extension Specialist, will present information from her research comparing the performance of Pinot noir with cane and spur pruning methods.

11:30 - Noon travel to second vineyard

12:00 - 1:00 PM Duck Pond Vineyard

Melanie Pierce, Duck Pond Vineyard manager and Cody Starnes, Pape Equipment manager

will demonstrate the Pellenc pre-pruner on a spur pruned vineyard. Dr. Jay Pscheidt, OSU Extension Plant Pathologist, will discuss grapevine trunk diseases and how to prevent them.
